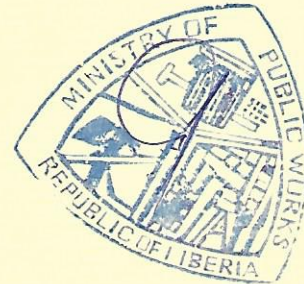

Subject: Certification of Achievement, Grand Kru County, Liberia

This letter serves to formally acknowledge the historic works of service to the people of Grand Kru County in Liberia by The Last Well and its partners. I hereby certify on behalf of the Government of Liberia that The Last Well has provided clean water throughout the entire County of Grand Kru. This outstanding activity has been accomplished in cooperation with the Ministry of Public Works, the Office of the County Superintendent, the Office of the President's Delivery Unit (PDU), the office of the Vice President, district officials, and the many non-governmental organizations that have faithfully served the people of the county of Grand Kru up to this day. This means that every known community in Grand Kru now has a reliable source of clean drinking water serving an average of 600 people per water source and that these water points have been strategically located to ensure that no person should walk more than 15 minutes to obtain clean water.

According to information obtained by my office, The Last Well has installed 92 new hand pumps, rehabilitated 65 hand pumps, and installed 1058 Clean Water Systems in Households across the entire county. These water points/sources are added to more than 90 working wells that were already in place due to the tireless efforts of the Liberian government and its relevant agencies as well as many other governmental and non-governmental organizations. This serves to show that great works come with great commitment to cooperation and an understanding that all of us serve on the shoulders of those who came before us.

Along with this certification, we acknowledge that The Last Well has successfully achieved the goal that every known community in Grand Kru now has a reliable source of clean drinking water serving an average of 600 people per water ~~point~~ source and that these water points have been strategically located to ensure that no person should walk more than 15 minutes to obtain clean water.



With clean water as a major development accomplishment, this leads the way for other important development goals for the future, including increasing the density of water points/sources from the current ratio of an average of 600 people per water point to the goal set by the Liberian government of 250 people per water point, as well as improved sanitation and hygiene education and facilities throughout Grand Kru and the rest of Liberia.
